- 2. What is the description of Death from Emily Dickinson's viewpoint? What is her attitude towards Death?
 - Death personified in the form of a gentleman. He arrives in a carriage with Immortality to take the author to her grave. (0.5 mark)
 - Like any gentleman caller of the time, Death is formal and polite, with the author noting "his civility." (0.5 mark)
 - The calm lyricism of the poem and the personification of Death alludes to Dickinson's comfort with the subject; she seems to regard death as a shift in perspective, rather than a total departure. (0.5 mark)
 - The very last stanza demonstrates that Dickinson regards death as eternity, rather than a final end.
 - → Death in this poem is not something to be feared, but should be greeted like a familiar face. (0.5 mark)
- 3. Explain why James Joyce links the character Little Chandler with the image of "A little cloud." What is the writer's emphasis? (3 marks)

A little cloud represents a portrait of Little Chandler with:

- His personality and appearance (1 mark)
- His desire to become a famous writer but in reality he could not advance his career (1 mark)
- The situation of his family: with his wife and the child (1 mark)

- 4. In what way are Della and Jim considered wise people in *The Gift of Magi*? (2 marks) Della and Jim are considered wise people because of:
- -Their sacrifice toward each other for the exchange of gifts (1 mark)
- -Their love toward each other against the situation of poor living condition (1 mark)
