TEACHING PRACTICUM EXCHANGE PROGRAM

(March $01^{st} - 28^{th}$, 2020)

- Duration: 28 days (from March 01st to March 28th, 2020)
- The program requires a minimum of 5 students to be organized.

This practicum exchange program is offered by Faculty of Foreign Languages (FFL), Ho Chi Minh City University of Technology and Education, in cooperation with **Ganesha University of Education** (Singaraja, Bali, Indonesia).

The program is open for final year students at FFL, who will do the teaching practicum as part of the TESOL program. The program aims to provide valuable opportunities for pre-service teachers of ESL to not only apply their acquired knowledge of teaching methodology in real-life classrooms but also broaden their understanding of international cultures.

Students participating in the program have to undergo a 4-week assessed practicum, which includes making classroom observations and practicing teaching English as a foreign language in Junior or Senior High Schools in partnership with Ganesha University of Education. During the program, students will also attend seminars and get involved in planned cultural and social events. Upon returning to Vietnam, student teachers will submit their portfolio reflecting their teaching practicum process and professional development from the experience.
